Instructions for Preparing Posters

Please note that poster presenters at the Asia Pacific Stroke Conference 2018 are required to produce and print their posters at their own expense.

ALLOCATED SPACE AND POSTER SIZE

- Posters will be displayed on free-standing boards within the Sultan Hotel Jakarta
- Your poster space allocation is A1 size (594 mm W x 841 mm H). POTRAIT layout Please note the poster space is extremely strict due to the limitations of the poster board size. **If your poster is unable to fit within the set guidelines, your poster will not be displayed.**
- Committee will provide **the tools to put up** the poster (ex:double tape/pinest/etc)
- Please note that the number allocated to your poster presentation will be on the corresponding poster board in the exhibition.

POSTER DISPLAY TIMES

- Posters will be displayed for the duration of the conference.
- Your poster **MUST** be displayed by no later than 0800 hours on Friday 7 September 2018
- Your poster **MUST** be removed by no later than 1500 hours on Sunday 9 September 2018

There are dedicated poster viewing sessions as outlined below. It is expected that poster presenters be available at their poster during these times to answer questions about their work.

POSTER FORMAT

- Posters should include the name(s) and affiliations of the author(s) to facilitate identification at the conference.
- All posters must carry a title. If a short title (different from the published full title) is used, the latter should be included as a subtitle in smaller type.
- In preparing the poster you should not attempt to detail your entire research history. Present only enough data to support conclusions or to explain the point(s) you wish to make. Data should be kept to a minimum in favour of diagrams and photographs. Aim to put across a simple message in an **eye-catching** manner.
- All text lettering, diagrams and photographs should be large enough to be legible at a distance of 1.5m. Lettering used for titles should be 24 point minimum (preferably Arial font). Large type from a word processor, photo-enlarged typing, stencilling, rub-down letters (eg Letraset) are recommended for text and captions. Freehand lettering is not recommended except for last-minute alterations.
